The Visionary Rev. Edgar J. Helms, a Methodist minister

Goodwill was founded in 1902 in Boston by E.J. Helms

Helms collected used household goods and clothing in wealthier areas of the city, then trained and hired those who were poor to mend and repair the used goods. The goods were then resold or were given to the people who repaired them.

The system worked, and the Goodwill philosophy of “a hand up, not a hand out” was born.



Helms described Goodwill Industries as an “industrial program as well as a social service enterprise...providing employment, training and rehabilitation for people of limited employability, and a source of temporary assistance for individuals whose resources were depleted.

Goodwill Industries International has a network of over 165 autonomous members in the US , Canada and 14 countries abroad.

To date **Goodwill International has diverted more than 2 Billion** pounds of donated goods from American’s landfill through the retail stores.



Founded in Camden, NJ in 1948, Goodwill Industries of Southern New Jersey & Philadelphia is a non profit community based organization, with its corporate headquarters in Maple Shade, NJ.

Goodwill Home Medical is a division of Goodwill Industries located in Ewing, NJ. Started in 2012, this division collects, sanitizes, refurbishes and sells gently used durable medical equipment, exercise equipment and unopened medical supplies at affordable prices.

What type of donations DO we accept ?

- Hospital beds, bed rails, Hoyer lifts, trapeze bars, tray tables
 - Wheelchairs, manual, transport, power and scooters
 - Lift chairs, fabric, stair lifts, Geri chairs, hip chairs, step stools
 - Pediatric equipment to include chairs, walkers, standers, tricycles
 - Exercise equipment, treadmills, cycling machines, steppers, weights
 - Canes, crutches, commodes, shower seats, bath chairs
 - Cushions, wedges, rolls, positioning pillows wheelchair cushions and backs
 - Walkers, rollators, walker baskets and accessories
 - Portable ramps and vehicle lifts
 - All unopened medical supplies, adult diapers and other soft goods

In the first quarter of 2017

Goodwill Home Medical diverted 39.05 tons (78,102.16 lbs.) of donated medical equipment from New Jersey landfills.

Average weight of items we recycle:

- Hoyer Lifts 116 lbs.
- Hospital Beds 170 lbs.
- Wheelchairs 25 lbs.
- Scooters 175 lbs.
- Batteries 10-25 lbs.
- Walkers / commodes / canes / crutches 3-10 lbs.
- Specialty items 70 lbs.
